# **Carntyne Parish Church**

Dear friends,

'The times they are a-changin' wrote Bob Dylan in 1963 and, in 2021, the times are indeed a-changin'. They are changing across the country and in our communities as we move away from stringent Covid restrictions and towards a 'new normal'. They are changing in Carntyne Church as Phase 1 of the Building Development is completed and we look towards Phase 2. The times are also changing within the National Church as it looks to rethink its structure as we move into the future.

Over the summer, the restrictions on wearing face coverings, social distancing and gathering in groups have been relaxed. At present, churches are subject to more constraints than elsewhere in that face coverings must still be worn at all times when inside a place of worship.

(Discussions about this are continuing between the Scottish Churches and Government representatives.)

The good news is that we are allowed to sing and to socially distance at 1 metre rather than 2 metres, although we have held back on this at Carntyne because of the building work. One metre social distancing will be introduced in the next few weeks.

We have been fortunate to be able to worship in the church during the last few months while the roof and window repairs have been ongoing. More detail about the work that has been carried out is given elsewhere in the Bulletin.

Perhaps the most significant of the changes we face are a consequence of decisions taken at the General Assembly in May. These decisions were taken in the knowledge that the Church doesn't have the money, or the people, to continue with business as usual. It's expected one in three ministers will retire in the next few years, and it's been known for a long time that we have too many church buildings.

Each Presbytery will now have to prepare a new plan taking into account a significant reduction on the number of ministry posts (ie Ministers of Word and Sacrament, Deacons and MDS). Glasgow Presbytery has been allocated 84 posts, down from approximately 140. The intention is to reach this level of staffing in 4-5years time.

The group enjoys carpet bowls, dominoes and darts and there is time for a chat over a cup of tea or coffee.

**The Men's Club** runs every Wednesday afternoon from 1.45-3.15pm and in the evening from 7.00-9.15pm.

We enjoy carpet bowls, pool, darts and dominoes, as well as a chat with a cup of tea/coffee. We have an annual outing and we are also looking to visit and welcome other Men's Clubs during the session.

We would be delighted to welcome members both old and new when our session kicks off on **Wednesday 1st September 2021.**

There is also time for a healthy snack and a drink. The Group meets on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday, 9.30-11.30 am, during school term time in the upstairs halls.

Boys' Brigade The new session will begin on Monday 13th September with Anchors at 6:30pm and Junior and Company sections from 7pm. Please note that BB staff will be available in the halls on Monday 6th from 7pm if parents want to fill in registration forms and ask any questions.

The Ladies Club will begin on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> September at 7pm in the downstairs hall. It is for ladies of all ages.

The new Plan will look at buildings - 'having the right spaces in the right places' - and at ways of make the best use of staff. With fewer paid staff, the voluntary service of thousands of members will remain an essential part of the church, with more opportunities for ministry exercised by the whole people of God.

The times are changing, and the Church must change with them in order to ensure that every individual in Scotland will continue, through the National Church, to have access to the comfort and challenge of the Gospel. ## **Church Building Refurbishment Update at August 2021**

In the last Bulletin the indications were that the expected completion date was 30<sup>th</sup> June. Unfortunately, the contractor found more dry and wet rot and this pushed out completion but we are very pleased to confirm that Phase 1 of our refurbishment project is complete as of Monday 16<sup>th</sup> August. We are very grateful to our Contractor W H Kirkwood Ltd. who coordinated the Project for us

The work started on 21<sup>st</sup> February and was a major project which covered stripping and repairing of all roof areas, identifying and eliminating Dry and Wet Rot, refurbishment and replacement of rainwater goods and refurbishment and repairs of all windows. The exterior Fabric of the building is now sound as we move in to the Autumn and Winter and we are very grateful for the generous Grant Support we received which, along with our local fundraising, meant that we could go ahead.

Many thanks also to all who contributed to the Slate appeal earlier this year which raised £1,033. This was a great help as although more than 50 % of the old slates were reclaimed after removal and inspection the rest were replaced with equivalent new versions.

In addition to the work mentioned, as part of this phase we took the opportunity to install a CCTV alarm system which is monitored 24 hours a day to protect the building and the new roof and lead work. As always, we ask everyone when passing the building to check around and report anything which looks out of the ordinary.

## Phase 2

Work has started on plans for the interior work to convert the Church building for multipurpose use to include all of the activities we currently hold in our halls as well as our regular acts of Worship.

Rebecca Cadie of ARPL Architects Ltd who headed Phase 1 for us has been reengaged to manage this next exciting phase for us and brings extensive experience of this type of work. A small team has been set up, including the Minister, Session Clerk and some Elders and members, which will be led by Rebecca, to come up with proposals for approval by the Congregation and the General Trustees.

We hope to have something to share with you over the next few months along with an estimate of cost so we can start the process of Fundraising and Grant Funding applications.

Our local Fundraising is very important as we have to demonstrate to funders that we have raised some of the cost ourselves. We were very successful with Phase 1 in that regard and although Fundraising activities will start in earnest from the end of this year all donations continue to be greatly appreciated and, as for Phase 1, should be marked for the Refurbishment Fund.
