I am just back from the church on Remembrance Sunday, having forgotten to get my article done on Friday, but I read the notice out at church that the deadline for articles is today, so here I am!!

A week or so ago, I was reflecting on the first four months here, by making a TikTok video for social media. Not everyone uses social media, however it's something that I do, and enjoy it as a pass time. TikTok is a place where you put small videos, and they can be yours that you make yourself, or something that other people make, and you share them out of interest. I use it to promote our community work at the church, and share stuff about my dogs Layla and Nanook, who some of you have met, and if you haven't you know I go on about them a bit too much!!

Today at the church I shared with the kids the St. Francis Assisi: "Preach the gospel at all times, and when necessary, use words", and I can do

that so easy with my dogs. They know they are loved cause I hug and kiss them all the time, walk them, feed them, don't go out at night as much to make sure they are ok, take them on holiday most of the time for them, give them treats, and have a basket full of toys just for them but, would my next door neighbour know that Jesus calls me to love her? Would she know that Jesus calls me to preach the gospel to her, just as much as we do on the Sunday? and to do it with actions rather than words? There are so many little ways we can do it, and ways we are already doing it now, that help us share and preach the gospel, but there is always room for us to do better, do more, and be effective.

In our last magazine, I said that I would share how I got into the ministry, and it was a gradual story, but one where I was shown love in action not words, and whilst its maybe a bit more than a few paragraphs of our magazine, there was a part of my story that happened when I was 16, and full of nonsense. I ended up in hospital having drank too much vodka on the way to the Christmas school disco, and I collapsed as I reached the school gates.

The following morning, around 6am, I was sent home with my parents, and did not know what had

happened. I woke at lunchtime, to be told what I had done. My punishment, grounded for a month, and had to attend church for 3 months (I had stopped going) and I dreaded it. I thought I was going to be judged, but nope, I got love, and it was the start of how 29 years later, I am typing in a study of a manse for an East End Church. "Preach the gospel at all times, and when necessary, use words"2 Thessalonians 3:3 Finally, our friends, pray for us that the Lord's message may continue to spread rapidly and be received with honour, just as it was among you.

STEWARDSHIP - FINANCE

We plan to hold a Stewardship campaign next year and one of the important areas we will look at is Finance. In the meantime, here is a reminder for everyone of the options we have available now for givings.

Free Will Offering Envelopes

These are valuable to plan weekly cash offerings and are available for everyone. They can be obtained through Gwen Robison.

Standing Order Givings

A growing number of folks find it easier to set up a standing order from their bank to the Church each month to avoid the need for cash. This is another great way of planning givings and if you would like to explore this option please contact Robert Fernie.

Gift Aid

If you pay income tax the Church can reclaim a further 25% on your giving from the Government. This a great source of income for us and means that for every £1 you give regularly we can claim a further £0.25 at no cost to you. All you need to do

is fill in a simple form saying that you pay tax and authorise us to claim Gift Aid. The agreement can be cancelled at any time if circumstances change. Please give this some though if you do pay Income Tax and if you wish to discuss please contact Robert Fernie.

He wasn't sure how successful he had been but he had tried. Here, in his own words, is the story of his last day.

He played me along for a few minutes and then revealed he had been at primary and secondary school with me. About 15 yrs ago he connected with me on FB through a mutual friend. He told me then that my faithful testimony at school had

played a part in him coming to faith several years later.

Well yesterday he drove from Dundee (114 miles) and said, 'I came to give you this.' "This" was a Timex watch. He said, 'I stole your watch at primary school so I want you to have this to replace it!! That must be at least 55 years ago. Godsmacked would be a good description.

Be encouraged that the Lord has all our lives safely 'in his hands' and through all the ups and downs His timing is perfect.'
God sees, God knows and He doesn't forget.

So keep on keeping on!'

COSY KNIT

Our city of Glasgow celebrates its 850th year in 2025.

To make this year special, Glasgow Presbytery is inviting all the churches in the Glasgow area to knit squares to make blankets.

When all squares are sown together we are hoping to have 850 blankets. These blankets will be put on display and then given to the Lodging House Mission.

We need your help with donations of wool and knitting needles. We need any double knitting or Arran wool you can spare and require No 10 and No 8 needles respectively.

The pattern is: Cast on 40 stitches. Every row is plain knitting until the square measures 8 inches, then cast off.

You can leave supplies and squares in the baskets at the front of the church.
